We are excited to share 2,522 dogs and cats found their families last year, and more than 34,000 have found homes since ARF's inception in 1991. At ARF, we measure our success not only by numbers, but with questions about our impact: Have we elevated the status of dogs and cats in today's society? Has a pet unlocked anxiety and depression for a person? How do we keep more pets in homes and out of public shelters? The answers to these questions drive us to grow our programs for "People Rescuing Animals...Animals Rescuing People®."

The launch of the Stephen Ball Spay Neuter Mobile Clinic this year to underserved communities and the Veterans Administration has been a wonderful addition to help

in pet retention and veterinary care. To ensure we can help even more pets, we recently launched ARF Pet Safety Net, a new program to keep more pets in their homes and out of public shelters.

Many veterans return from deployment with physical and emotional injuries, which often make it difficult to transition back into day-to-day life. The companionship of an animal can help build confidence and restore independence. ARF's Pets for Vets program pairs shelter pets as emotional support animals with our brave servicemembers. Along with our MVP adoption program, we found homes with military families for nearly 150 pets last year.





ARF pairs young readers with a Pet Hug Pack® therapy dog to help children improve skills, instill confidence, and develop a love of reading. Studies confirm the numerous benefits of dogs as calming, non-judgmental reading partners.

Pets for Vets




Veterans returning from combat often struggle with PTSD, TBI (traumatic brain injuries), or service-related mental health conditions as they transition back to civilian life. As service animals, Pets for Vets dogs can accompany their veterans in public, helping to rebuild confidence and restore independence.

Each Pets for Vets participant is interviewed and carefully matched with a dog to meet their needs. Specialized group and individual training at ARF helps veterans teach their dogs supportive tasks to become full-fledged service dogs. Group classes provide support and instruction in the company and comradery of other veteran-dog teams, while private sessions help veterans meet individual goals.





All adoption services and training are provided at no cost to the veteran. The Pets for Vets program provides powerful therapeutic and practical benefits for veterans through the quiet, unconditional love of a pet.



Pet Retention

Disaster Relief

In response to natural disasters and cruelty cases, ARF deploys medical and rescue teams nationally to set up temporary shelters and care for displaced animals. This year, ARF provided veterinary assistance and animal care at a temporary shelter to nearly 700 pets rescued from a large-scale cruelty situation in North Carolina.





ARF Emergency Medical Fund® (EMF)

EMF provides residents of Contra Costa County with affordable, non-emergency veterinary care for their pets during times of serious financial crisis. EMF treated 161 dogs and 71 cats this year.


ARF Dog Training

ARF Dog Training provided 261 dog training classes to 1,210 students this year.





Since launching the program in late spring, the Mobile Clinic has brought crucial veterinary care for free or at low-cost to more than 1,000 public animals – and counting!


